PLAB Exam Structure

The PLAB exam consists of two parts:

- 1. **PLAB 1**: A written, theory-based exam.
- 2. PLAB 2: A practical, skills-based assessment.

PLAB 1 Overview

- Format: 180 multiple-choice questions.
- Duration: 3 hours.
- Focus: Application of knowledge in patient care.
- Frequency: Held 4 times annually in various locations worldwide, including the UK.
- Question Format: Clinical scenarios with five answer choices. Select the best one.

PLAB 2 Overview

- Format: Objective Structured Clinical Exam (OSCE).
- Duration: 16 stations, each lasting 8 minutes.
- Focus: Clinical skills like history-taking, physical examination, diagnosis, and communication.
- Location: Conducted exclusively at GMC Assessment Centres in Manchester, UK.
- Frequency: Dates available throughout the year.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Primary Medical Qualification:

You must hold a recognized medical degree listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools.

2. English Proficiency:

- o IELTS: Minimum overall score of 7.5, with 7.0 in each component.
- OET: Grade B in all areas.
