

What is the NCLEX Exam?

The demand for registered nurses is high in countries like Australia, the United States, Canada, and the Netherlands. To address the staff shortage, these countries invite international nurses to work in their healthcare systems.

The National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN), monitored by Pearson VUE, assesses the competence of registered nurses. Clearing this exam allows nurses to apply for work or permanent residency (PR) visas in their desired country. The best part? The NCLEX exam can be taken in your home country.

NCLEX Exam Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the NCLEX exam, you must meet the following requirements:

Criteria	Details
Educational Qualification	A Bachelor of Nursing or a relevant four-year degree
Registration	Must be a registered nurse in your home country or any other country
Work Experience	Not mandatory, but beneficial



NCLEX Exam Process

The NCLEX examination process consists off four major steps:

1. Initial Assessment

- The National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) or the respective nursing authority assesses your eligibility.
- An online application form must be submitted.
- Upon approval, you receive permission to take the NCLEX exam.

2. NCLEX MCQ Exam

- A computer-based exam available throughout the year.
- Can be taken at the nearest Pearson VUE testing center.
- The test consists of 75 to 145 multiple-choice questions (MCQs).
- A minimum of 75 correct responses is required to pass.

3. English Proficiency Test

- Most countries require proof of English proficiency.
- Accepted tests include IELTS, PTE, TOEFL, or OET.
- Clearing this step is essential for the visa application process.

4. OSCE Exam (Objective Structured Clinical Examination)

- A practical skills assessment conducted by the nursing board of the destination country.
- For example, in Australia, the Nursing and Midwifery Board (NMBA) administers the OSCE.
- Passing this step qualifies you for a work/PR visa.

NCLEX Exam Format

The NCLEX MCQ exam is divided into three levels:

Level	Focus Area
Level 1	Knowledge and understanding
Level 2	Analysis and application
Level 3	Critical thinking and aptitude

The number of questions can range from 75 to 256, but a minimum score of 75 marks is required to pass.

NCLEX Testing Centers in India

If you reside in India, NCLEX testing centers are widely available. The five major Pearson VUE centers in India are:
